

## **A Look Back at Recent Drafts by Tony Villiotti**

With the Super Bowl now behind us, attention will begin to turn to the NFL Draft that will take place beginning on April 26 and concluding on April 28. This is the first in a weekly series of articles by **DRAFTMETRICS** covering various aspects of the draft.

This article takes a look back at the 10 most recent drafts (2002-2011) with **DRAFTMETRICS** offering its two cents on the winners and losers in those drafts. For the more recent drafts it is, of course, very premature to proclaim such winners and losers. (This doesn't stop the draft experts from handing out draft grades the day after the draft.) In keeping with this presidential election year, though, **DRAFTMETRICS** will provide the "early returns" for each draft year.

**DRAFTMETRICS** considered a number of factors in deciding on the winners and losers including:

- The number and location (e.g., how many first round choices, etc.) of a team's draft selections
- The number of years a player played for the team that drafted him
- The number of years a player started (a player is considered a starter in any season where he started at least eight games) for the team that drafted him
- Post-season honors won by a player while playing for the team that drafted him
- The number of games started for the team that drafted them by the draft class as a group

For each year there is a separate table for the winners and the losers. The information contained in the tables will be the same for each year and for winners and losers and will contain the following information:

- The name of the teams in each category, with the team with the best draft shown first in the winner's table and the team with the worst draft shown first in the loser's table
- The number of draft selections made by a team in the first round, second round, third round and in total .
- The number of career starts by that draft class for that team
  - For example, if Joe Smith was drafted by the 49ers in 2002 and during his career started 20 games for the 49ers and 15 games for the Bears only the 20 games he started for the 49ers would be included in this column for the 49ers
- The number of starter years for that team
  - As mentioned above a starter year is defined to be the number of seasons a player starts eight or more games
  - As with career starts, the number of starter years shown is only those years starting for the team that drafted him
